

# New-York, March 28.

The Brig *Cambden*, Capt. Deane, of this Port, who sailed from hence the 26th of November, arrived in 47 Days at Kinsale, and at Liverpool 13 Days afterwards. They met with a dreadful Storm the 19th of December, when they were struck by a terrible Sea, which carried almost every Thing off the Deck, together with the Mate and 12 or other Men, his whole Watch, broke the Tiller, and turned the Vessel almost Bottom upwards. In this distressful Situation they remained some Time, expecting every Minute would be their last. But providentially the Weather moderated, and after much Hardship and Difficulty, they got safe into Port.

In the hard Gale of Wind and Snow Shower we had here on Saturday Night the 30th Instant, a Servant Man, and a valuable Slave belonging to Mr. Pakenian, of Long-Island, were both drowned in a Pettyauger, going across the River with Dung for their Master's Farm.

The *Hibernia*, Keith, from Philadelphia for Bristol, is lost on the Welch Hook, but the crew is saved.

The *Beulah*, Capt. Henderson, from this Port is arrived at Dover.

Yesterday the Ship *Earl of Hillsborough*, sailed for Belfast, in which Vessel went Passengers, Mr. Hamilton Young, Mr. Robert Ewing, and Mr. William Park, of this City, Merchants, and some others.

About 4 o'Clock this Morning, a Fire broke out in an old Stable, in the back Part of the House of Beverly Robinson, of this City, in which there was Hay, &c. which was entirely consumed, and Part of the back Kitchen at the Post-Office, damaged.---The Wind being pretty high, the Flames communicated to two Store Houses, in Pettycoat-Lane, belonging to Mr. Henry Ludlow, and Mr. Theophilact Bache, but by the usual Alertness of the Inhabitants, the Fire was happily subdued, without doing any considerable damage.
